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The Long Road to Bethlehem, Part 3 "Abraham and Israel"

God's love finds those who do not close their heart. Not all turn away from Him, not all walk indifferently through their time on earth, not all remain asleep and keep their ears closed to the call of God. There are also the faithful!

God finds Abraham, the father of believers!

"Yahweh said to Abram, Leave your country, your kindred and your father's house for a country which I shall show you; and I shall make you a great nation, I shall bless you and make your name famous; you are to be a blessing! I shall bless those who bless you, and shall curse those who curse you, and all clans on earth will bless themselves by you." (Gen 12:1-3)
